

Intra-Africa Academic Mobility Scheme Summary of the selection results of the first call for proposals

In the framework of the first call for proposals of the Intra-Africa Academic Mobility Scheme, the Education, Audiovisual and Culture Executive Agency received 38 proposals by the deadline on 15/06/2016, out of which 33 were eligible.

With an available budget of around EUR 9.9 million, 7 projects were selected for funding.

Overall, in spite of the limited number of projects selected, a good regional coverage was achieved:

- ➤ 29 different African higher education institutions are involved out of which 14 (i.e. 50%) are newcomers (i.e. have not participated in the previous Intra-ACP Academic Mobility Scheme).
- In terms of institutional participation (partners from Africa), higher education institutions from Ethiopia and South Africa are the most represented as applicants and/or partners, i.e. five (5) participations each, followed by Morocco (4) and Nigeria (3).
- ➤ Universities from Kenya and Morocco are the most represented as coordinating institution, i.e. two (2) proposals each.
- All regions of Africa are well represented with a predominance of Eastern and Western Africa.
- ➤ The average partnership composition is of 5-6 higher education institutions as applicants/partners.
- The most represented EU countries are Belgium and France, both participating with two EU technical partners.
- More than one thematic field could be addressed by each project and the resulting thematic coverage with the selected projects is the following:
 - Agriculture and Food Security, Health Sciences and Engineering addressed by 57% of the projects (i.e. 4 projects). These were also the most represented thematic fields in the eligible applications received;
 - o Social Sciences and Governance addressed by 43% of the projects (i.e. 3 projects);
 - o Education Sciences by 28% of the projects (i.e. 2 projects).
