ESTABLISHMENT OF THE UNIVERSITY

The UNIVERSITY OF GHANA was founded in 1948 as the University College of the Gold Coast on the recommendation of the Asquith Commission on Higher Education in the then British colonies.

The Asquith Commission, which was set up in 1943 to investigate higher education, recommended among other things, the setting up of University Colleges in association with the University of London. This was followed up by a number of separate Commissions in different regions. The West Africa Commission was under the Chairmanship of the Rt. Hon. Walter Elliot. The Elliot Commission published a majority report which recommended the establishment of two University Colleges in the Gold Coast (Ghana) and Nigeria, and a minority report which held that only one University College for the whole of British West Africa was feasible.

The British Government at first accepted the minority report of the Elliot Commission and decided that a University College for the whole of British West Africa should be established at Ibadan in Nigeria. However, the people

of the Gold Coast did not accept this recommendation, and urged the Gold Coast Government to inform the British Government that the Gold Coast could support a University College. Accordingly, the British Government reviewed its decision and agreed to the establishment of the University College of the Gold Coast.

The University College of the Gold Coast was founded by Ordinance on August 11, 1948 for the purpose of providing for and promoting university education, learning and research. Its first Principal was Mr. David Mowbray Balme, a far-sighted and courageous leader dedicated to the promotion of scholarship. By his vision, industry and single-mindedness of purpose, he built a college and laid the foundations for a sound University which is now a source of pride. In his ten years as Principal, he created an institution whose key-note was orderly living with dignity in a community of scholars.

One of the recommendations, of the Asquith Commission was that the British Government should set up an Inter-Universities Council to advise on all matters

relating to Higher Education in the new British Colonies. Based on this recommendation, an Inter-Universities Council was set up to serve the new University College of the Gold Coast in an advisory capacity, and to approve all academic appointments. This arrangement helped the College to maintain the high academic standards associated with the Universities in Britain. Also, it enabled the College to seek support of the Council in obtaining funds from the United Kingdom Government sources.

From its inception, the University College of the Gold Coast was admitted to the Scheme of Special Relationship extended by the University of London to certain English and overseas University Colleges. Under this scheme, the University College was allowed to teach for the external degree examinations of London University. It also allowed the College to modify the London syllabuses to suit local conditions and to take part in the setting and marking of examinations. However, London University gave final approval to courses and examinations since the degrees given were those of the University of London. For thirteen years, therefore, the University College looked up to two separate institutions in Great Britain: to

the Inter-Universities Council for guidance on its broad policy, and to the University of London for approval and control of details of degree regulations. The University College benefitted greatly from this arrangement which certainly helped to maintain its high academic standards.

In the 1960-61 academic year, the College Council made a request to the Government of Ghana for legislation to constitute the University College into a University with the power to award its own degrees. The Government appointed an International Commission to examine the issue. On the recommendations of that Commission, the University of Ghana was set up by an Act of Parliament on October 1, 1961 (Act 79). The President of the Republic of Ghana, Dr. Kwame Nkrumah, then became the first Chancellor of the University, with Nana Kobina Nketsia IV, BLitt DPhil (Oxon), Omanhene of Essikado, as the (Interim) Vice-Chancellor.

The University of Ghana, the premier university in Ghana, was founded as the University College of the Gold Coast by Ordinance on August 11, 1948 for the purpose of providing and promoting university education, learning and research.

As the premier university in Ghana, the University aims to produce the next generation of thought leaders to drive national development. Through its research institutes and other centres of learning and research, faculty members are involved in studies that support policy making for national development, often in collaboration with other international institutions.

The Research and Innovation Directorate (formerly the Office of Research, Innovation and Development (ORID) has the mandate to promote, facilitate and coordinate research. The University's research agenda is outlined in the Research Strategy (2024-2029).

The University has also established academic and research links with several other universities and research institutions worldwide and is linked to the Worldwide Universities Network (WUN), Norwegian Universities' Committee for Development Research and Education (NUFU), the Council for International Educational Exchange (CIEE), International

Student Exchange Programmes (ISEP) and the Commonwealth Universities Student Exchange Consortium (CUSAC), among others.

Currently, there are twenty (20) institutes/colleges locally which hold affiliation with the University of Ghana for the purpose of enrolment, teaching and award of degrees and diplomas. These affiliations cover non-degree, bachelor's degree and post-graduate degree programmes.

UNIVERSITY OF GHANA CAMPUSES



The University of Ghana has five main campuses: Legon, Korle-Bu, Accra City Campus, Kumasi City Campus and Takoradi City Campus.

The Legon Campus: This is the main campus where most of the University's teaching and research are carried out. It also houses the central administration of the University.

The Legon campus lies about 13 kilometres north-east of Accra, the capital of Ghana, at an altitude of between 300 and 400 feet. From the Main University Gate on the National Highway 4 (N4), the University Avenue extends to Commonwealth Hall on Legon Hill.

Halls of residence, departments, lecture theatres and laboratories are grouped along the J. B. Danquah Avenue. Mid-way is an open space – the University Square – with an ornamental fountain overlooking the Balme Library (named after David Mowbray Balme, the first Principal of the University College). Behind the Balme Library is the Samuel Kenneth Aboah Recreational Quadrangle. Across from the University Square are sports fields and halls of residence.



Behind Commonwealth Hall is an open-air theatre with a Grecian style auditorium built into the slope of Legon Hill. On the summit of Legon Hill is the Convocation Group of Buildings which houses the University's central administration offices, the Great Hall, with a seating capacity of 1,000 and a tower donated by the Government of Ghana in 1957 to commemorate Ghana's Independence. On the southern side of the campus are residential accommodation for staff, the University Basic School, a Banking Square, the Noguchi Memorial Institute for Medical Research, School of Public Health, Sports Stadium, student residences and the University of Ghana Medical Centre. On the Northern side are teaching departments, lecture theatres and laboratories. Across the N4 from the Main University Gate, is a Police Station, and behind it is the University Hospital and houses for junior and senior staff.

The Korle-Bu Campus: The Korle-Bu Campus houses the administration of the College of Health Sciences, which is headed by a Provost. Some of the constituent schools located on the Korle-Bu Campus are University of Ghana Medical School, University of Ghana Dental School and the School of Biomedical and Allied Health Sciences.

Accra City Campus: Located in the heart of Accra's central business district, the Accra City Campus offers a unique, non-residential learning environment. Established in February 2014, the Accra City Campus evolved from the former External Degree Centre, previously housed at the Accra Workers' College. This strategic transformation has enabled the campus to thrive as a hub for cross-disciplinary studies.

Kumasi City Campus: The Kumasi City Campus is housed at the erstwhile Kumasi Workers' College, established in 1962. It is located behind Kumasi Technical Institute and WAEC offices. The Workers' College used to provide further education to workers and served as a learning centre for Distance Education students. Aside the Distance Education programmes, Kumasi City Campus recently started running regular programmes.

Takoradi City Campus: The Takoradi City Campus is located at the former Takoradi Workers' College, established in 1962 at Chapel Hill in Takoradi, near the Ghana Ports and Harbours Authority (GPHA) Hospital. It was the regional branch of the then Institute of Public Education and currently serves as a learning centre for the Distance Education programmes. The Takoradi City Campus has started running regular programmes.

FEBRUARY 2026 MATRICULATION

Today we are gathered to matriculate students who have enrolled for academic programmes in the 2025/2026 academic year, leading to degrees at the various colleges and the Accra City Campus. We will confer on these new students, membership of the University of Ghana.

Separate matriculation ceremonies will be held for students on the Distance Education programme and students on special programmes later in the year. Matriculation ceremonies are in line with **Article 31** of the University of Ghana Act, 2010, Act 806 which states that:

- (1) A student admitted to the University shall take the Matriculation Oath and sign the Matriculation Register.
- (2) A student who fails to sign the Matriculation Register may be prevented from graduating by the University.

Visiting students and other short-stay students who are studying at the University for one or two semesters are not part of this ceremony, but are expected to observe the same rules and regulations as matriculated students, while they are here.

The ceremony is in three parts.

In Part 1, we will hear an address from the Vice-Chancellor, Professor Nana Aba Appiah Amfo, read on her behalf by the Provosts of the various Colleges/ Principal of Accra City Campus. We will be informed about the significance of the matriculation oath and what the University expects from its students.

In Part 2, students will swear the Matriculation Oath to be administered by the College Registrar on behalf of the Registrar – the oath can be found on the University’s website and on page 28.

You will repeat the words of the oath after College Registrar at the appropriate time.

After the Oath, one representative of the students will tell us the expectations of the 2025/2026 cohort of students and ceremonially sign the Matricula; which is the Latin word for the Register.

The third part of the ceremony takes place online. Each student is to go online and electronically sign the Matriculation Oath. That is the record that indeed

you are registered as a student in the University of Ghana and have accepted to abide by the oath that you are about to swear. Many of you have already signed the oath online. Thank you. We urge all who have not yet done their registration to go online and do this as soon as this ceremony is over.

Freshmen and women, distinguished ladies and gentlemen, on behalf of the Registrar, we say thank you to all colleagues, at all levels, for the roles they have played in the process of admitting students, working on registration, orientation, matriculation and allocation of beds.

Matriculation class of 2025/2026 academic year, we look forward to seeing you engage actively in University activities and wish you well in your stay at the University of Ghana.
