Distinguished Ladies and Gentlemen, Praise the Lord.

A year ago, on 30th August 2022, the University of Ghana launched the celebration of its 75th anniversary. Following the successful launch held at a colourful ceremony in the Great Hall, very exciting and equally thought-provoking programmes have been held.

As a university, this anniversary has been a period of introspection and reflection. Having operated for the past seven and a half decades, there was the need to take stock of our achievements, make time to celebrate this significant milestone, but more importantly re-strategize for a more impactful 75 years ahead. With this in mind, distinguished ladies and gentlemen, I constituted the 75th Anniversary Planning Committee, a 22member Committee, with the mandate to plan a year-long series of programmes that will culminate into the realization of a legacy project and other fundraising activities to undertake key infrastructural projects at the University. The anniversary celebrations were to be very engaging and to include all stakeholders of the University community (faculty, staff, students, alumni, friends of the University and our local communities). Under the direction of the two able Co-chairs, Prof. Akosua Adomako Ampofo and Prof. Clement Appah, and with support from the Secretariat headed by Mrs. Joanna Omaboe, the University has experienced a very vibrant and impactful anniversary year.

Mr. President, with your kind permission, permit me to walk you through highlights of our 75th anniversary journey. Selected photos of some of the events have been displayed in the brochure as well as screens mounted in the foyer of this very auditorium.

1. ANNIVERSARY THEME:

Our anniversary theme is – "Nurturing Resilience, Adopting Technology, Embracing Humanism".

- Resilience: this component is inspired from the University's tenacity to stand tall amid challenges.
- Technology: Our quest to let technology drive all our processes is greater now than ever.
- Humanism: In our pursuit to create knowledge and produce expert human resources, we will not forget to pursue public good.

These concepts which make up the theme align with my key strategic objectives as Vice-Chancellor.

2. ANNIVERSARY LOGO

A logo competition was launched, and several entries were received from members of the University community. The review panel settled on the design from Dr. Kofi Sarpong Adu-Manu, a lecturer at the Department of Computer Science.

Your Excellency, ladies and gentlemen, the 75th anniversary logo is not only beautiful aesthetically as you can see but it also has very interesting and revealing emblems/symbols which I will share with you: Colours: Seventy-five in UG branded colours: (7) in gold
 and (5) in deep blue –

Gold: expresses dynamism and freshness.

<u>Deep blue</u>: demonstrates academic depth and serenity of the environment.

- Symbols:
 - <u>Mframadan</u>: This is an Akan symbol for well-ventilated dwelling. It is a symbol of fortitude and willingness to tackle life's ups and downs, representing "resilience";
 - o <u>Human icon</u>: representing Humanism
 - <u>Circuit</u>: circular in shape to show togetherness,
 representing technology,
 - *Leaves*: a symbol of life and growth.
- *UG logo* (Crest): Signifying the University of Ghana.

3. ANNIVERSARY EVENTS

• Lecture-Type Programmes

A total of four high-profile public lectures have been held on various topics of national interest.

- The first was an Energy Lecture delivered by Mr.
 Egbert Faibille Jnr., CEO, Petroleum Commission,
 Ghana in January this year. This lecture attracted
 many stakeholders with key takeouts to strengthen
 the energy sector.
- In March this year, the University hosted Mr. Manasseh Azure Awuni for a dispassionate dialogue on Ghana's 66th Independence. The lecture unearthed and reminded the audience of actions and inactions that have culminated in the Ghana we have today. He called on all to rethink and reform to build a prosperous nation.
- This was followed by a public lecture on the Economy by Dr. Yao Graham of the Third World Network Africa on a very important topic of restructuring the national economy for accelerated development.
- Through collaboration with the Harvard Centre for African Studies, the University hosted the 2023 JS
 Agyepong Distinguished Lecture on Public Health in Africa which also generated phenomenal feedback from participants. This lecture was delivered by Prof.

Peter Lamptey of the London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine.

• Semi-Formal Interactive Programme

- An Evening of Relaxation and Lessons in Resilience
 was held at JamRock Restaurant with Mrs. Elizabeth
 O. Olympio-Emanuel in February, and
- On March 6, 2023, Mr. Kwame Ametepee Tsikata, an artiste popularly known as M.anifest, engaged an audience, in this hall, in a conversation on the potential of the creative arts industry for national development.

• Fun and Sports Programmes

With support from the Sports Directorate and other units of the University, a number of sporting events were organized – two alumni health walks, students' sporting events and staff games among others. Pupils of the University Basic School were not left out in the celebration.

• Community Service

Some of the humanistic initiatives during this anniversary year included a blood donation exercise, tree planting exercise and a mega health/psycho-social outreach programme which is planned for August 18 at the Madina Market for vulnerable individuals who ordinarily may not have access to such services.

• Wear UG Day

Your Excellency, ladies and gentlemen, there's one more event for me to announce. The Planning Committee doesn't know about this. Academic Board nor Business and Executive Committee hasn't debated nor approved this. Your Excellency, I am instituting this by executive instrument. Today is our birthday. The Ordinance establishing the University College was passed by the Gold Coast Legislature on 11th August, 1948. On 11th October 1948, the formal opening of the University College took place in the Dining Hall of the western compound of Achimota School. So, if 11th August is our birthday, 11th October is our outdooring day. To commemorate our Day of Outdooring, on 11th October, we will have a Wear UG Day. Irrespective of where you find yourself, once you are

a UG student, staff, faculty, alumni, friend or affiliate, on that day, wear something made from our beautiful 75th anniversary cloth, take a photo, post it on social media and hashtag it UGIS75.

• Special Programmes

- <u>Special Congregation</u>: At a Special Congregation held in April, eighteen (18) personalities who had distinguished themselves in various fields of endeavour were awarded honourary doctorate degrees of the University of Ghana.
- <u>Day of Scientific Renaissance of Africa</u>: Various units of the University held a series of events and community engagements to showcase the research work and innovations championed by the faculty, staff and students of the University of Ghana in the month of June.
- <u>Anniversaries within the 75th Anniversary</u>: While the University marked its 75th anniversary, a number of units and departments i.e: Medical School, Business School, Department of Communication Studies,

School of Graduate Studies, Regional Institute for Population Studies, School of Engineering Sciences, School of Nursing and Midwifery, Department of Political Science, the SRC and GRASAG, among others, held prgrammes to mark their anniversaries.

4. LEGACY PROJECT

Management of the University has approved the construction of a Student Experience Centre as the main UG@75 legacy project. The proposed project is a multipurpose avant-garde facility with state-of-the-art equipment which will serve as a one-stop centre for a variety of students' needs. A Leadership Training Centre and Incubation Hub are included to provide a space where University faculty, leadership, and students could nature ideas and acquire leadership skills. Additionally, the Centre will house satellite offices of units that provide student services and respond to student needs, such as the Offices of the Dean of Student Affairs, Academic Affairs, Students with Special Needs/Disabilities, Students Financial Aid Office and Careers and Counseling Centre. We will also have a Students' Clinic in there. Finally, to enable it be income-generating, it should include multipurpose meeting rooms, spaces for commercial activities, such as banking, and a food court, and of course well-kept washrooms open to guests.

To complement donations received so far towards this project, a fundraising dinner will be organized in December 2023. We entreat our stakeholders to lookout for notices on this programme.

Right from independence, through the various dispensations of our history as people, the nation has benefited from some of the finest UG brains for national development. In the field of Science, Applied Science, Business, Arts and Humanities, UG has been at the forefront of groundbreaking research and innovations. UG has produced astute legal luminaries who have distinguished themselves not only within the national jurisdiction but also on high-profile international assignments.
